Community Foundation of Greater Des Moines Reaps Farmland Benefits

A rose to Fred Weitz for a donation of farmland that could reap results for decades in central Iowa. Weitz is a longtime community leader, founder of Life Care Services and former CEO of Weitz Co., where he made his family's construction company a national operation. In December, he donated a 176-acre farm in Benton County to the Community Foundation of Greater Des Moines. On Feb. 9, the foundation sold the farm for \$2.5 million, or \$14,300 an acre. The money will support the Community Foundation's "Better Together Fund," which provides grants to groups and individuals that "maintain and improve the region's quality of life and economic viability."

The Community Foundation had another great year, attracting more than \$76.4 million in gifts and making more than \$42.5 million in grants in 2017. Recent recipients of its leadership grants include \$100,000 to the Director's Council to address racial disparities in its One Economy project; \$75,000 to launch the Des Moines office of the Kids First Law Center; and \$75,000 to Des Moines Heritage Trust for the renovation of the 1909 Des Moines Union Depot. *Excerpted from the Des Moines Register*

Partnership Rolls Out National Digital Campaign to Lure Talent

A new digital campaign from the **Greater Des Moines Partnership** will use videos of current residents to show prospective workers and businesses the types of lifestyles represented in Greater Des Moines. The idea is to help with a chronic worker shortage by showing, as the Partnership's Mary Bontrager said, "they can have it all here."

Tiffany Tauscheck, the Partnership's chief strategy officer, noted that Partnership investors have made it clear they need a bigger labor pool, something Tauscheck sees as an opportunity. "Our investors have said talent is No. 1 on their list of priorities. It is a huge opportunity for our region. One of our priorities is to drive talent attraction." Research the Partnership conducted that led to the DSM USA identifier and branding campaign showed evidence that Des Moines should promote itself as vibrant, affordable, accessible, welcoming and diverse, Tauscheck said.

The videos will run two minutes max, and probably as short as 15 or 30 seconds. They will be on the Partnership's website and on social media. The conversation will include the #DSMUSA <u>Facebook page</u>, where you can tell your story or make a comment on the region, and you can submit a blog post.

Bontrager added that part of the mission is to show people that Greater Des Moines offers what they — and their businesses — seek. "People look at place first and job second. So much of this campaign is telling the story of DSM USA," Bontrager said. "We are allowing some of our own residents to help us tell that story through their lens and their voices." *Article from the Business Record by Perry Beeman*

Farm Bureau, Wellmark propose health benefit alternative for farmers

lowa's statewide farm organization thinks it has a plan to help farmers who are struggling to find affordable health insurance, the Mason City Globe Gazette reported. Under the proposal, **Wellmark** would create health benefit plans for **Farm Bureau** members. The benefit plans, which would not be regulated as insurance, would be designed to be affordable for lower-income farmers. Without the requirement that the plans meet Affordable Care Act benchmarks, the plans could be cheaper than ACA-compliant plans. Tens of thousands of Farm Bureau members could be eligible for the health benefit plans, which are under consideration by the lowa Legislature, lowa Farm Bureau President Craig Hill said. *Article from the Business Record Daily*

Broadlawns/UnityPoint psychiatry residency program receives accreditation

Broadlawns Medical Center and **UnityPoint Health-Des Moines** announced today that their jointly administered psychiatry residency program has earned full accreditation from the Accreditation Council for



Graduate Medical Education (ACGME). The Broadlawns and UnityPoint Health Psychiatry Residency program will welcome its first class of four residents into the four-year training program in July. Dr. Larry Severidt, Broadlawns' director of medical education, said the new program is "a critical component toward expanding the number of trained psychiatrists in the state of Iowa and addressing the mental health issues that we are facing in our community." Iowa currently ranks 49th out of 50 states in the number of practicing psychiatrists per capita. *Article from the Business Record Daily*

Wellmark Foundation's BlueCare Giving generates \$1.8 million for Iowa nonprofits

More than 570 lowa nonprofit organizations received \$1.8 million in funding this year through the Wellmark Foundation BlueCare Giving program. The foundation said today in a release that Wellmark employees logged nearly 38,000 volunteer hours with qualified nonprofit organizations. Through the BluesCare Giving program, Wellmark employees who volunteer their time have the opportunity to choose a nonprofit organization to be the recipient of matching gifts from the foundation, which resulted in contributions of more than \$1.8 million to nonprofit organizations across the state. The top five recipients of funds from the program were: Variety – the Children's Charity; Iowa State University Foundation; United Way of Central Iowa; Animal Rescue League-Des Moines; and Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. *Article from the Business Record Daily*

Hubbell provides a homeownership option in Gray's Station development

Hubbell Realty Co. has released plans to build 89 townhome units in its Gray's Station development between Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway and the Raccoon River in downtown Des Moines, along with the first images of a bridge that will span the river and provide a link to Gray's Lake. The for-sale townhomes come in a range of sizes and styles, including attached and detached units and condominiums. The company plans to begin building streets and trails in the 75-acre development this summer. Plans call for bridge construction to begin in July, with construction of the townhomes scheduled to begin in October. Hubbell previously released plans for 200 apartment units in two buildings, along with space for commercial tenants, that will front Martin Luther King Jr. Parkway along with a plaza that will provide a view beyond the apartments to the sprawling development. Hubbell President and CEO Rick Tollakson said the for-sale units will provide an alternative for downtown renters who are ready to buy a home but have limited options if they want to remain downtown. *Article from the Business Record Daily*

Grand View Claims Seventh-Straight National Title

Grand View continues the rewrite the wrestling record book as the program won an unprecedented seventh-straight team title at the 2018 NAIA Wrestling National Championships. The 61st annual event took place at the Jacobson Exhibition Center March 2 & 3.

Grand View, fueled by 10 All-Americans, scored 171.5 team points. The victory makes the Vikings the fourth program in collegiate wrestling history to win seven-straight team titles, joining NCAA Division I Iowa (nine-straight 1978-86), NCAA Division I Oklahoma State (seven-straight 1937-1949) and then-NCAA Division II Cal Poly (seven-straight 1968-1974).

Henning Received Education Leadership Award

The Chinese Association of Iowa selected honorees of the 2017 Iowa Chinese Achievement Awards on November 19, 2017. The Association presented the awards at Grand View on February 17, 2018. Kent Henning, Grand View University President, received the Education Leadership Award. This award is designed to recognize the exceptional leadership of active, front-line leaders who make a difference in the lives of students every day. Candidates were judged on leadership for learning, communication, professionalism and community involvement.


